
UPINTHE TREETOPS

Ask A Question



A We asked Richard of Myriad Toys for his recommendations and he suggested Eyes of the Jungle, a co-operative game in which players work together to protect rare species in the rainforest. Another game for older children, Sky Travellers, encourages knowledge of earth's habitats in order to repair a spacecraft.
